COURSE GUIDELINES

1. You will note that this course uses MyStatLab for homework, exams and access to lectures. MyStatLab access comes with the bundle sold by the bookstore for the course. If you purchase the text separately, MyStatLab **does not** come with the text. You must login to MyStatLab immediately. Instructions come with the access you purchased. If you have not yet purchased the MyStatLab access, you can get temporary access for a limited time at the website: www.pearsonmylab.com. You can also purchase the access separately at the website. Lectures and handouts for the week can be found in the announcements after you login.
2. You will have homework, four exams, and a final. Getting signed up in MyStatLab and Examity before midnight, Saturday 1/26 is 5% of the grade. The homework will be worth 20% of the grade, exams 50%, and final 25% of the grade. To receive full credit on the homework, assignments must be completed by the due date. There is a 20% penalty for late submissions. There is 0% credit if not completed by the final exam.
3. **Each week you must download, print, and listen to ALL lectures during the week. You must listen to the lectures BEFORE midnight, Saturday. For every 5 lectures that you fail to listen to BEFORE midnight, Saturday, there will be a 1 grade penalty for the course.**

COURSE OBJECTIVES

The objectives of this course are to provide the student with a basic understanding of statistical inference in the areas of estimation, and hypotheses testing. Thus, the student should acquire:

- A. An insight into the need and role of statistical inference in the analysis of data.
- B. An ability to read and understand technical literature, now rather commonly interwove with statistical terminology.
- C. An understanding of elementary probability theory:
 1. As background for upper level computer science courses.
 2. As a necessary foundation for subsequent courses such as operations research.
- D. To introduce students to a statistical computing package (Minitab) and use this package to solve problems in probability and statistics.
